Top 10 Records That Have Not Been Broken

72 holes-257 (60-68-64-65), by Mike Souchak at the Brackenridge Park G. Cse., San Antonio, Tex., in the 1955 Texas Open.

18 holes-59, by Al Geiberger in second round of 1977 Danny Thomas Memphis Classic; 59, by Chip Beck in third round of 1991 Las Vegas Invitational.

9 holes-27, by Mike Souchak during his round of 60 (33-27) in the 1955 Texas Open; by Andy North on second nine of the first round at 1975 B.C. Open.

Consecutive birdies-8, by Bob Goalby in the fourth round of the 1961 St. Petersburg Open; by Fuzzy Zoeller in the first round of the 1976 Ed McMahon Quad Cities Open; by Dewey Arnette in the first round of 1987 Buick Open.

Fewest putts (18 holes)-18, by Sam Trahan in the second round of the 1979 IVB-Philadelphia Classic; by Mike McGee

in the first round of 1987 St. Jude Classic; by Kenny Knox in the first round of the 1989 MCI Heritage Classic; by Andy North in the second round of the 1990 Anheuser-Busch Golf Classic; by Jim McGovern in the second round of the 1992 FedEx St. Jude Classic.

Consecutive wins-11, by Byron Nelson in 1945.

Consecutive times in money-113, by Byron Nelson in the 1940s. Jack Nicklaus had a streak broken at 105 (1970-1976) at the 1976 World Open.

Most wins, single season-18, by Byron Nelson, 1945.

Consecutive major championships-Walter Hagen's four PGA Championships (1924-'27). (photo)

Most wins in a single event-8, by Sam Snead, Greater Greensboro Open in 1938, 1946, 1949, 1950, 1955, 1956, 1960 and 1965.
